Notification for Publication of Preliminary Documentation under the Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999 (EPBC Act).

The following notice is published pursuant to Section 95B(2) of the EPBC Act.

Gladstone Ports Corporation Limited (GPC) is seeking approval to progress the Clinton Vessel Interaction Project (EPBC Act Ref: 2017/7976), which seeks to prevent vessel interaction with moored vessels at the RG Tanna Coal Terminal wharf, by performing capital dredging to widen the Clinton Channel located in Gladstone, Queensland. It has been determined that the proposed action is likely to have a significant impact on World Heritage properties (Sections 12 and 15A), National Heritage places (Sections 15B & 15C), Listed threatened species and communities (Sections 18 & 18A) and Listed migratory species (Sections 20 & 20A).

The finalised Preliminary Documentation report for the project will be available for public display for a period of 10 business days from Tuesday 5 February to Monday 18 February 2019 at each of the following locations:
